- Substance Abuse is broken down for this data.
- "No Substance Abuse Noted", note that this is SA is probably a co-occurring disability but may not be the identified primary disability. The State has more reliable data. We have the Opioid pilot programs on high-risk areas.
- Although participants aren't required to be in treatment, it could affect their ability to find employment and may not end up being serviceable. It is under-reported.
